WARCnet meeting, 13-15 June 2022

Under the heading 'Web archive features and futures' the fifth WARCnet meeting aims to:

- consider the key features of web archives and web archive studies that have been highlighted by the WARCnet project,
- explore how a greater understanding of these features will help to inform future directions for web archives.

Within the meeting there are six types of sessions:





Within the Transport for London network (including tube and buses) you can pay for travel using a contactless card or mobile device (including Apple and Google Pay). 
