

The Digital Reading Condition



The Reading Between Media Group at Aarhus University invites all interested participants to a one-day seminar on *The Digital Reading Condition*

This seminar proposes an interdisciplinary introduction to digital reading practices. What does it mean to read digitally today? How does what we call the digital reading condition encourage us to read in new ways? What are some of the key reading practices that have emerged after the first three decades of the world wide web, amidst an increasing number of digital devices and an incessant digitally mediated information flow?

To fully understand what the current digital reading condition entails, we argue that the act of reading itself is changing, and rather than rejecting digital media as not suitable for sustained or focused reading practices, the complex media landscape that includes all kinds of media forms and remediated practices—including reading—challenges us to rethink how to define reading as a mediated practice. Also, the digital reading condition foregrounds the importance of understanding how senses are explicitly invoked while reading digital material that often include images, sounds, movement and interactive elements in addition to text.

The seminar will be held on **Thursday, February 11**th **2021 from 1 pm to 6 pm**.
