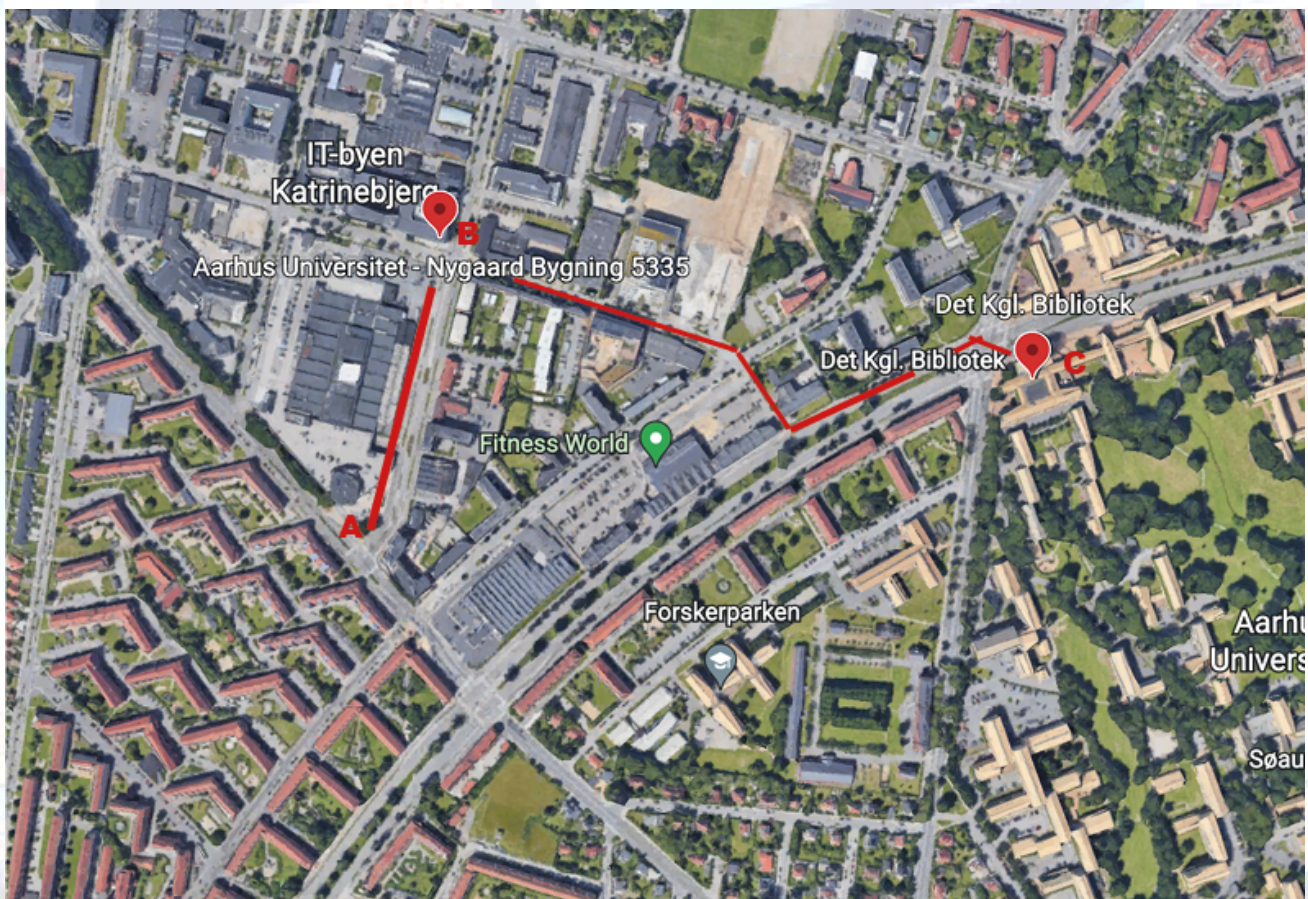

# Guides

## Getting to the venue

You may want to walk, which takes app. 45 minutes, the address is Helsingforsgade 14. Or you can take bus no. 2A, heading towards 'AUH Skejby' (indicated at the front of the bus). We recommend you download the app 'Midttrafik'  (name of the bus company) and buy your ticket there (2 zones, adult), in the menu item 'Min konto' you can change language to English ('Skift sprog'). Otherwise, tickets can only be purchased in the ticket machine in the middle of the bus (coins and self service only), 22 DKK. You should get off the bus at Storcenter Nord.

- **C** = Det kgl. Bibliotek



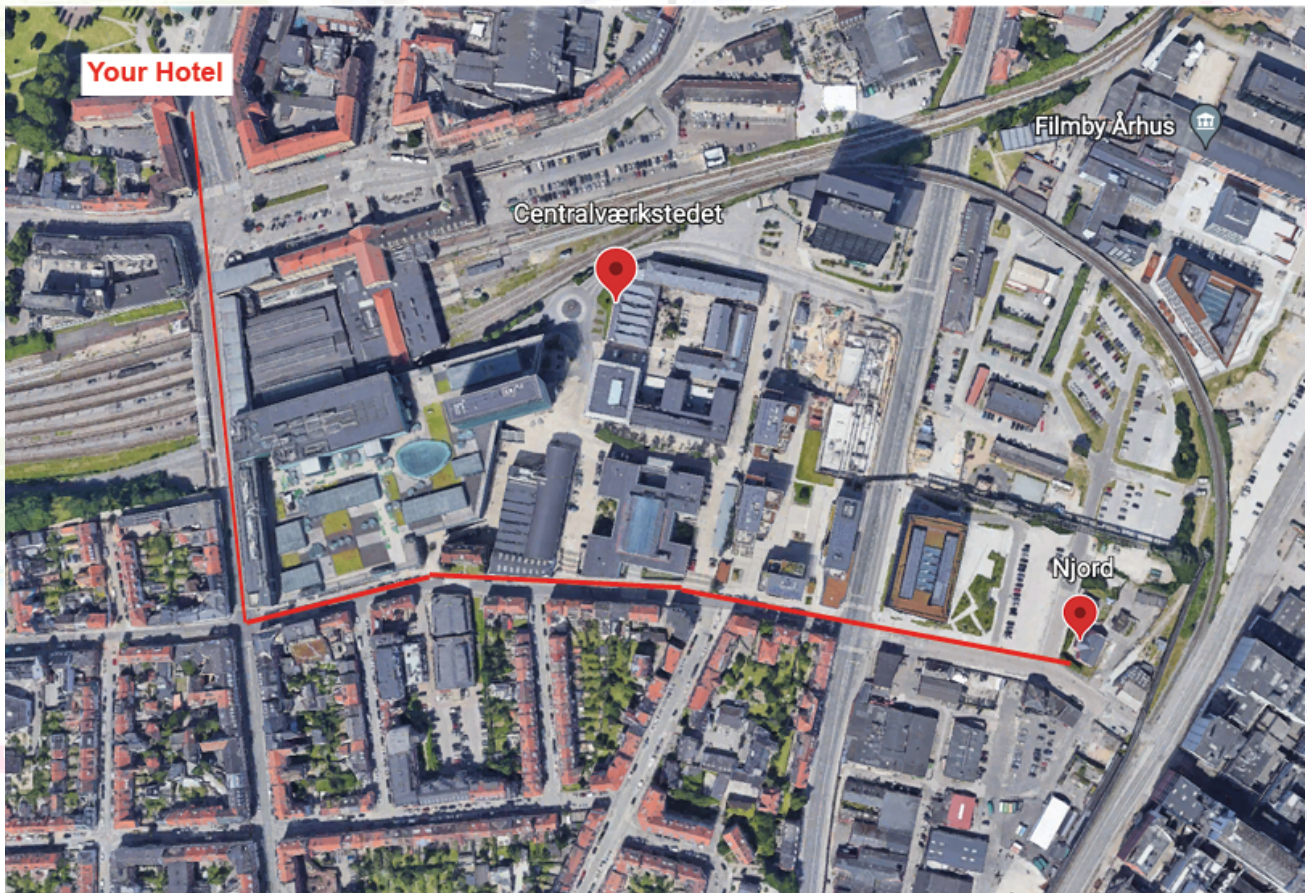
